




Student Satisfaction Survey Report on Teaching – Learning Process (the Year 2017-18)

No. of students who have given feedback – 95


(The values in the graph are the percentages)




The students were surveyed regarding the applicability of the syllabus to the current working environment. The above graph contains the responses in percentages. It is inferred that the majority of the respondents agreed (35%) that the syllabus studied them apply to their present working scenario. But there are about 20% of the respondents who have also disagreed the same.




The students were enquired if the teaching and mentoring process facilitated their cognitive, social and economic growth. A majority (61%) agreed with the statement, while 10% strongly agreed, 21% were neutral and 8% of respondents also disagreed.




The student satisfaction survey asked students to describe the teacher's approach to teaching. Most of the respondents opined that the approach to teaching was very good (40%), 31% of them opined that the approach was excellent, 23% respondents said that the teaching approach was average and 6% opined that it was below average.




The students were questioned if they feel that the faculty illustrated the concepts through examples and applications. Most of the respondents agreed (47%) and 35% of the respondents strongly agreed. There were no disagreements with the statement.




The students opined that the examination evaluation process was very good (39%), and 32% of the students opined that it was excellent. A minuscule percentage (7%) of the students felt it was below average.



The students were asked to opine about the availability of books and materials at the Institute library. Most of the students strongly agreed (46%) that the books and materials were available at the Institute, and close to an equal percentage (44%) also agreed to the same.




The majority of the students strongly agreed (48%) that the Institute's computer lab was well equipped.




The students were enquired if the Institution provided them with multiple opportunities to learn and grow. Most of the respondents agreed (46%), 30% of the respondents strongly agreed and 18% were neutral and the remaining disagreed.

Q 9 : All the activities and programs have succeeded in enhancing my skill and confidence level




The students were questioned if the activities and programs at the Institute helped them to enhance their skill and confidence level. Most of the respondents agreed (43%), 33% of the respondents strongly agreed and 22% were neutral and the remaining disagreed.


Q11: I feel the staff of the computer lab and library are cooperative and helpful



The cooperativeness and helpfulness of the computer and library staff were enquired and most of the students either strongly agreed (49%) or agreed (47%) to the statement that the staff were cooperative.




Students were questioned on the cooperativeness and completeness of the work by the administrative staff and the majority of the students (45%) agreed and 34% strongly agreed. There were 15% of the neutral respondents and 6% disagreed with it.




The satisfaction level of students was checked. 50% of the students opined that they were satisfied with the academics, co-curricular and extra-curriculum programs of the Institute, about 38% were highly satisfied, 18% were neutral and 4% were dissatisfied.

Q14: How satisfied are you with the overall facilities provided by the Institute?



Satisfaction towards overall facilities provided by the Institute was enquired and the majority of students opined they were satisfied (62%), and 23% were highly satisfied.

Q15: What is your overall satisfaction level towards the Institution?



Students opined that about 45% had overall satisfaction towards Institution and 24% were highly satisfied and a miniscule 5% of the students were also dissatisfied.
